Bear is the name for several kinds of large, meat-eating animals with thick fur, heavy bodies, and wide heads. It can be said bears are among the best-known of the world's large wild animals. They are often seen in zoos, ( ① ) their playful tricks make them favorites with children. Several kinds of bears were once quite common in North America, Asia, and Europe. They may still be seen in the wilder parts of these lands.

Though bears are called meat-eating animals, they seem to eat many kinds of foods. Their favorite foods are small animals of the woods, (②) fish, insects and their young, and birds' eggs. They also eat lambs and young pigs, which they steal from nearby farms. Other foods include fruits, berries, nuts, and the leaves and roots of plants. Bears are (③) honey and they will tear apart the nests of bees to get at ④ it. Their long fur helps to protect them from the stings of the angry bees.

Black bears spend much of the winter <u>⑤</u> (sleep) in warm shelters in caves, hollow trees, or holes <u>⑥</u> (make) in the earth. When the weather is very severe or food is scarce, the bears may not stir out of their sleeping shelters for months at a time. The babies are born here in midwinter. At birth baby bears are blind and have no teeth. They stay inside with their mother until they are about two months old. They grow rapidly and reach full growth in about two years.

A recent report from a United Nations group warns that using technology in classes may not help as much as many people believe. The report suggests that [ ① ], and that smartphones should be banned from classrooms.

UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization) is a group that was created so that countries can help each other to improve aspects which are related to education, science, and culture around the world. One part of UNESCO's work includes studying different problems and ideas, and then creating reports and making suggestions.

The goal of the new report was to improve the use of technology in schools. The report says that technology can be helpful, but it shouldn't be the focus. Instead, technology should be used to support learning. ② "Too much attention on technology in schools usually causes a lot of troubles," the report says.

Over the last 20 years, technology has been used more and more in schools. As classes moved online during the Covid-19 pandemic, the use of technology in education grew even more quickly. These days, it's ( ③ ) for students to use computers or tablets. In many places, it's normal for students to look up information on the internet rather than using books.

UNESCO admits that technology can help in many ways. It can allow students to learn in ways that are more interesting; it can help teachers explain difficult ideas; it can also help students who have special needs.

But UNESCO says technology can also be very distracting. When students use smartphones in class, it can interfere with their learning. One study that was carried out in 14 countries showed that even just having a smartphone nearby can be distracting. ( 4 ), UNESCO says that only 25% of the world's countries ban phones in schools.

"We need to teach children to live both with and without technology," said Manos Antoninis, the director behind the UNESCO report. The report suggests that the best way to learn is still to work closely with teachers. Working with other classmates also helps students learn. UNESCO says that most schools should spend more money on things like books, classrooms, and teachers.
